WARRIORS AND WARLORDS NEWS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

WW WORK WEEKENDS

Work weekends started on May 13th and will go on right up until WW work week. Useful items to bring with you include work gloves, shovels, axes, chainsaws, rakes, post-diggers, etc. Don't forget sunscreen, water, and bug repellent, too! Thanks to THL Matthias, there is a covered base camp set up in Strawboss complete with a fire pit, coffee pot, small refrigerator, etc. All coming to work on land areas are welcome to camp in that area for free for the weekend.

Each work weekend will be hosted by the Autocrats and their deputies. Below is the current schedule. Please be aware that there may be changes and keep an eye on the Nib and Facebook for updates.

CAMPING RESERVATIONS

Camping at WW is available by reserving spaces or by dropping in and choosing from remaining areas. There's a lot of room, so last-minute arrivals can be accommodated. Just let the Gate volunteers know that you need a space when you arrive and they will direct you to the open spaces.

Camping space can be reserved in advance in one of two ways: Sweat Equity or Preregistration.

Sweat Equity is an unusual SCA reservation practice, but one that has been in play at our current event location. The land is undeveloped and many groups have worked to develop small areas into beautiful campsites. Those gentles who have invested their personal time and money into the beautification of their campsites have earned the right to re-claim that same spot each year. Each group needs to have a representative connect with the Autocrats before the end of May of the current year indicating their intentions to use the same area as the previous year. In order to help expedite the Trolling-in process at Gate, a list of those adults expecting to camp in the group's area should be submitted via the Sweat Equity form. No preregistration payments are needed and attendance plans are transferable to others within the group.

Preregistration for WW is offered to those people who are unable to participate in the sweat equity process but still want to have camping land reserved for them. This is a good way for out-of-town groups and households who wish to camp together to make sure that they are not scattered throughout the campground or chopping down trees when they arrive. Payment and reservation details (Name, estimated arrival date & time, and camping area preferences) **must be received by June 23rd** to guarantee that a spot will be held. No additional fees will be charged to have land reserved, but know that preregistration payments are not refundable.

WANT TO ARRIVE EARLY ON WEDNESDAY EVENING, JULY 12?

If you want to come early on Wednesday, you must volunteer officially on the WW website AND notify the autocrat. Each individual in your group must volunteer on their own.

JOB DESCRIPTION FOR LAND MANAGER FOR NORDSKOGEN ENCAMPMENT AT WW

Items Needed:

Graph paper (or a rule and ability to mark out feet on a regular sheet of paper if no graph paper) Paper and scissors to cut out models of the tent footprints

WW Cartographer's map

Size in feet of Nordskogen encampment, including location of entrance and exits for cars, location of trees, etc. (A site visit may be in order.)

25' tape measure or surveyor's ruler, alternately a measuring wheel, for helping people find their locations on the ground.

What you will do:

Solicit footprints of tents and associated structures (such as cooking tents, armor tents, shade flies) from folks wishing to camp with Nordskogen at WW. Draw out a map of the encampment using the dimensions you've been given. You should plan on being in camp on Wednesday evening so that when people start arriving you can have them camp in the right places. You should have at least one deputy who can tell folks where to camp if you need to be out of camp on Thursday or Friday morning as folks are arriving.

Process:

You will solicit from folks camping with Nordskogen the size of their tent footprint, including any flies and the tent rope extensions. For example, a 10 x 12 tent will frequently have a footprint of 13' x 15' when the tent ropes included. If they have preferences on who they camp next to, or "not near the Baronial pavilion" you should take these into account, as well. Make sure people give you the dimensions of their cooking tents, shade pavilions, etc., as well as just their tent.

Once you have all the requests in, draw out the encampment on two sheets of 8 1/2" x 11" paper taped together. Mark off the encampment in foot intervals so that you can tell how long and wide the encampment is. Place trees and a roadway into and out of the encampment so folks can get in to unload and load out.

Using the same scale as you used for the drawing of the encampment, make little paper squares that signify each of the tent footprints you have received. Be sure to include the Baronial pavilion and any other special structures that will be in the encampment. Label each of the squares with the name of the person who will be in it.

Place the tent squares in the encampment using the preferences and other criteria you've received. Planners for events such as Pennsic and Gulf put 3' between each tent to provide safe margins in case of fires or other calamities.

Start placing the squares around the outside of the encampment, then fill in the center as the edges get full. Generally for aesthetics it's good to place the period pavilions toward the road and around the Baronial Pavilion and the modern tents toward the back of the encampment. Be sure and leave walkways to enable folks to get to their tents without tripping over other folk's tent ropes or finding themselves trapped in a cul-de-sac of canvas.

When you have everyone placed, with luck there will be some open space for folks who didn't "pre-register" with you and who come in last minute needing to camp.

Tape down the squares so that they stay in place. Make at least one copy. Laminate one of the copies for use in the camp itself.

Pre-reg will be set up for other folks. Can pre-reg online. Once payment has been received, folks will be guaranteed a spot. This can be done as individuals and as groups.
