#### **Activities Performed:**

Ran the archery activities for Schutzenfest. Did oversight of 29 Marshals and MITs conducting inspections, range setup and take down, Marshaling of the line, and making sure participants, Marshal, and MITs signed appropriate paperwork. We wanted to be extra safe and made sure everyone had a good time.



Baroness Coquette du Lyons, is sponsoring a Bardic challenge at WW25 to find a Warriors & Warlords theme song of sorts, one that can be sung annually. The three criteria will be: 1: upbeat; 2: singable by mere mortals; 3: has a chorus that encourages the populace to join in. After the Torchlight Tournament on Friday night is over, the Baroness will come to the Bardic circle and the competition will commence at the end of the current performance or perhaps the next after that. Her Majesty has approved of the winner leading us in singing it at Saturday night's Royal Court.

# BARDIC (con.)

# **About WW Bardic Circles**

When I went to my first WW \*mumblemumble\* years ago, I thought the bardic circle was a private party and avoided it. Aaaaand that's how I missed my very first bardic circle. So here is what you can expect at the WW Bardic Circle (the official one; all bets are off for private camp circles):

- --Everyone is welcome! Yes, YOU!
- --Stay hydrated (and bring your own cup). Singing is work, too. If there is no water left in the orange water cooler, inform the circle host and/or Courtesy Patrol. Bringing/passing around snacks and beverages is appreciated.
- --Sounds like the Bardic Area is behind the pole barn on the main road this year. If you don't like it, please don't complain.
- --Basic Bardic etiquette: Don't interrupt or talk over someone else's performance. Do sing along (harmony welcome) unless the performer asks that people do not. Feel free to play along with instruments unless the performer asks that people do not. Please do not idly noodle on your instrument as it is unclear sometimes whether you are performing or just noodling. No one except current Royalty is allowed to perform two pieces in a row. 10 pm is the cutoff time between "family friendly" and "adult themes okay".
- --If you want to perform and can't figure out how to find a moment to do so, ask the circle host. Sometimes there is a format to the circle and they can inform you of that. Other times it is just "jump in", but the host knows that that's not always easy for people to do and can find a good moment for you/announce you if needed. If you don't know who the circle host is, watch for the person making occasional announcements, or ask others.
- --Generally there is no difference between "front row" and "back row" (i.e. one is not for performers vs. observers). If you really, really don't want to get invited to perform, inform the circle host.
- --There is someone in charge of fire. Unless invited, please don't assume there isn't and jump in and start playing with the fire. Cooking food is okay as long as you let the fire burn normally (it is usually our only light).
- --If you need a flashlight, ask to borrow one, but then return it promptly. In the same vein, control your flashlight so it isn't shining in the eyes of your neighbor or someone across the circle.
- --If you need a song sheet, ask. If you take a song sheet, and you don't want to take it with you when you leave (please do take it with you!), give it back to a person, don't just leave it on a bench. The dew makes them dissolve and they do cost money to produce.
- --Re: Dew: sitting on the ground can get wet late at night. Bring something to sit on. There are benches, though these go on walkabout during the Bad Baroness/Torchlight Tourney and Saturday night court. Chairs can be left at the circle area during the whole event, but don't forget them when you leave site!
- --If you are still there during the wee hours of Saturday night or during pack up on Sunday morning, ask the circle host about helping to take down the benches. Many hands make light work. Please don't do it without asking; there is a technique.
- --I think that's everything! If something is confusing or you feel slighted or upset by something that happens at the Bardic Circle, please bring it up with the circle host or someone who has a Bardic Clue (or me, I'm only a Bardic Laurel, what do I know (a)...). Despite the fact that our art happens late at night when we are already tired and might say things without thinking, we really do want to make the Bardic Circle welcoming and cozy for all!

# Aiglets, Medieval, Post Medieval And Modern, Thurs., 7-8 PM, Court Pavilion, All ages

Greetings from THL Gerald Loosehelm! If you will be on site Thursday evening, I invite you to attend my lecture: "Aiglets Medieval Post Medieval and Modern". This will be a longer version of the presentation I gave at the 5th Annual Symposium on Medieval and Renaissance Studies, hosted by the Center for Medieval and Renaissance Studies on the campus of Saint Louis University, in 2017. I am planning about 40 to 45 minutes of lecture time and whatever time it takes for questions afterwards. The class will be at 7 pm Thursday night in the Court Pavilion. Course Description: Aiglets, lace tags, chapes, are all terms describing items that are in some way used to finish the end of laces, thongs or cords. Aiglets still are in use today in the 21st century where they are utilitarian as well as decorative elements on laces for shoes, corsets and other clothing. This presentation will look at the history of aiglets, how they were manufactured in the past and how they are manufactured today. Emphasis will be placed on aiglets as they were manufactured and used during the 16th century. (Please be aware that I will be filming this presentation to possibly put on my website.)

# **Duel at Dawn, Taking Place Friday-Sunday**

Brothers and Sisters of the blade, who dance the Duello!

It is that time again, and dueling season is upon us. I, Baron Jean-Robert LeMarchand de Sel, am running the Duel at Dawn on the Rapier field again this year.

Those who participate are a small group, and to join their number is to be in rare company. So, without further ado, here are the rules:

The Duel at Dawn is a rapier challenge run over three days starting Friday morning.

When you register at the list you are put into one of two rival "schools": Libro or Spada. You will have an arm band identifying which school you belong to. You may pick a fight with someone of the rival school at any time the list is open. Fights are non-destructive and can happen in the public area as long as there is a marshal present. Report to the list your wins, and you are able to fight the same person more than once but please limit to no more than 3 refights. We suggest finding a reason to pick a fight i.e. "All Spadas are thugs!" "Oh yeah! All Libros are pasty bookworms!" Fight! Fight! You get the idea.

Saturday morning, the 5 fighters with the most recorded wins will progress. This time you may fight anyone from the pool of 10 regardless whether they belong to your school or not. Fights are destructive, so if you are dealt a moral blow, you are out. Double kills, while unfortunate, are not re-fought and both fighters are removed from the list. Because dueling is illegal, fights should be taken out of public view, possibly with seconds and definitely a marshal. Wins and deaths are reported to the list. FIGHTS DO NOT HAVE TO BE TO THE DEATH! To first blood is fine if both combatants agree. But accidents do happen...

It is suggested you step up your method of picking a fight.

"Do you bite your thumb at us sir!" "I do bite my thumb, sir" etc., etc., dead body in the street. The two fighters with the most wins, or still surviving progress to Sunday.

Sunday is treated like an actual duel. Seconds are named the evening before and negotiate the specifics of the duel. Sunday morning the primaries and secondaries are treated to a full breakfast in a last attempt to make peace before bloodshed. If an agreement is not reached, the group take a short walk to discuss matters of honor and botany. The survivor will receive a small token to go with their bragging rights.
