Meeting called to order at 7:30 pm.

Officers' Reports

Their Excellencies Baroness Cynthia and Baroness Heliseus: Baroness Cynthia: We had a blast at Toys for Tots. Quite a few mon-Nordskogeners came. We will be working on scroll cases tomorrow. Next: we are planning on going to Boar's Head.

Seneschal, THL Judith of Northwode: Everyone did a great job at Toys for Tots. Thanks, Gospatric! Huge to have something under the tree when you don't expect it. We also will be traveling to Boars Head and are looking forward to the Baronial event in January 2025. Questions? Concerns? Feel free to reach out to me.

Master Crispin Fletcher and Lady Dagrún will be the archery marshals. Rapier schedule put together. Will the Princess Sleeve be happening at Twelfth Night? We need Bardic Coordinator, Lady Iðunn has agreed to come up with more children's activities. Will be reserving the stage to use possibly for the A&S displays. Tribaldi feels it would be better for viewing than for display. Tribaldi: His lady hopes to do a storytime for the children. Please put it on the schedule. Willing to extend that out to other activities if children are interested. Should we reach out to moneyers guild for tokens? Our traditional dessert lady can't come.

Spring Coronation Update

No needs just now says Lord Aleksandr. Will have the schedule ready to go as soon as pre-reg is happening. Their Highnesses definitely approve the site.

Twelfth Night Theme and Name

Making sure that name and theme are inclusive for all.

Theme

Apology from Their Excellencies. Baroness Cynthia: Acknowledged that Noel has a Christian aspect that is not appropriate to our goals. Nordic, blue and white, snowy aspects needed to be considered for the new theme. THL Judith (Nordskogen Seneschal): read out SCA DEI statement and then stated the parameters of the discussion. The meeting will be muted only if necessary. Raise hand to participate. Please state your SCA name and group. Will close chat if that gets too messy. Try to keep your comments to 2-3 minutes. Baroness Heliseus: We are now discussing the theme. Name of event will be discussed later. Lord Tribaldi (from Nordskogen): Just "A Nordic 12th Night"? Her Highness Aelina: Personally speaking, not as Crown. Note of warning: Nordic used to be associated with Nazi Party, Aryan. No longer so true. More bothered by using an obvious Chapel for swearing fealty. Lord Aleksander (from Nordskogen): Northern, instead of just Nordic, like northern Italy and other countries. Northern lights, Northern Knights. Baron Gabriel Kjotvason (from Nordskogen): Theme not really important. Delay having a theme until next year. Baroness Heliseus: Blue and silver snowflakes as a theme. Baroness Rosanore (from Nordskogen): Does the theme need a name? (Meistari Sefa Farmansdóttir (from Nordskogen) said something similar in the chat.) Nordskogen Nights, North Forest Nights. Baroness Heliseus: Considering having no theme at all. Baron Gabriel: Populace usually has no input in theme unless as a part of the bid. THL Judith: The theme was not part of the original bid. Their Excellencies and the Event Steward, Lady Talaitha, will decide on this by Friday.

Name

Question of event name came up as part of the theme discussion. Twelfth Night first held in the West Kingdom then adopted in the Midrealm for similar events including in Northshield. Was originally inspired by the Shakespearean play. Does have religious connotations in period. Also have pagan connections. Baroness Rosanore (from Nordskogen): Unitarian Universalist. If the title is objectionable even to a small number of people and makes them uncomfortable with attending an event, we should strongly consider changing it. Magister Farolfus filius Richardi (from Nordskogen): Speaking as a Jewish member of the Barony, he noted that no Jewish person can speak for all. There was no "sacred" "secular" divide in period. Twelfth Night was a holiday of things turned upside down. This discussion offers us a chance to examine what we've been doing, all of our activities? Not just changing one event's name. Lord Tribaldi from Nordskogen): Practicing Christian. Has never looked at Twelfth Night as a Christian holiday. Long ago, everything got thrown in the blender and they covered old holidays with Christian ones. Most folks knowledge only consists of the song. Are we making an issue of something that isn't one? Holidays are silly we have a bunny that lays eggs. Baron Geoffrey (from Nordskogen): Have had Twelfth Night for many years and it is kind of a hallmark for our group. We have a track record of holding an inclusive, secular event. It would be sad to leave it behind because of our long successful connection. Baron Gabriel: Former Catholic and Episcopalian who was considering becoming a priest. Christians should know what Epiphany is. He had never heard of the connection between Twelfth Night and Epiphany until the SCA. Twelfth Night is a secular thing associated with the SCA. Only the name has any connection to Christianity, not anything else about the event. Let's not change this name. The reasoning is ill-advised. Erica Poitevins (from Nordskogen): Agrees with Gabriel. Has been agnostic and has Ashkenazi ancestors. Has never thought of the event as anything but secular. THL Judith (from Nordskogen): As Seneschal, is neutral. Agnostic and Ashkenazic. Has always felt that this event is secular. Have bigger fish to fry than an event's title. Lady Talaitha (from Nordskogen; the Event Steward): Grateful for this really great discussion. THL Muirenn (from Nordskogen): Commenting as a scribe. This discussion has made me think about how much religion is woven into our period. Her current scroll project is based on a Bible page. Has already calligraphed Twelfth Night onto a scroll. Please make this change, if at all, for next year. A study of the Middle Ages without religion is really beige. Their Excellencies: This has been a good conversation. Her Highness Aelina, speaking as Hannah Story: Happy with this conversation. Moving the dates events because of their conflict Jewish holidays means a lot more to her than changing a theme. Lord Aleksandr: I wonder if having things like Twelfth Night and Boars Head in our very secular SCA way is a way of gently touching these things. Going to Twelfth Night is not celebrating Christmas. Gently touching things that make us uncomfortable can help us become stronger as a community and help us learn why these things do make us uncomfortable. Important to bring up these concerns and look at them under a different light. Their Excellencies: Knows the person who brought this up. Maybe this is a big feeling that is directed somewhere else? Kind of a mislaid feeling? Fear manifests itself. Lord Aleksandr: There is no fault in having

those feelings. We want to make everyone feel included. But the hair trigger feelings of now make it hard. These are good conversations to have. THL Judith: Appreciates strength and courage of person who brought this up. Anyone who has such concerns should reach out to us. Lord Tribaldi: Feels like people are trying to control what they can in this current context. Their Excellencies: We appreciate everyone coming here and expressing their thoughts. We will take this time and reflect and will express our decision before this weekend. It is important that we as a Kingdom reflect on our activities and look at our history and not just depend on oral tradition. Want to listen so that everyone feels included. Lord Aleksandr: His therapist says that when you are having feelings about something that you are having anxiety over don't worry about stating it perfectly. Feels like everyone in this Barony is trying to listen and to understand.

Meeting adjourned at 8:56pm. Baron Gabriel Kjotvason made the motion. Lord Aleksandr seconded it.

GENERAL NEWS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

Theme and Title for Our January 18, 2025 Event

Greetings members of Northshield. Our Nordskogen Business Meeting covered two important topics this past Wednesday. One, to review and revise the theme of Twelfth Night (previously, a Nordic Noel) and two, to discuss the standing title of the event; Twelfth Night. Due to the length and consideration both these topics deserve, we will be separating the discussion into two parts.

Pt. 1

The theme Nordic Noel was brought to our attention as a concern, with the focus of the term Noel being overly focused on one religion, to the exclusion of others. Upon review, the word Noel has significant and current meaning to the Christian faith; specifically focusing on the birth of Jesus. This religious aspect does not accurately represent this year's theme and has been adjusted to Frosty Fete, to celebrate the Baroness' desire to see the symbol of the snowflake worn, adorned, and celebrated throughout the event.

We recognize the impact of the initial theme had on members of the Kingdom and want to apologize for the pain we have caused. The Baronesses of Nordskogen are appreciative of the opportunity to improve and solidify our overarching goal as a Barony; to have gatherings with historical premises that expand our horizons, celebrate milestones, or reflect particular historical objects / activities.

This also encouraged us to re-evaluate our efforts to keep and maintain an open dialogue. We plan on continuing our efforts to be accessible, seek to understand perspectives, and actively listen. Pt. 2

A second question arose during the discussion of this year's event theme, regarding the title Twelfth Night, and whether it should continue in use for future events. As many Scadians do, we conducted our research on the origin of the event title.

We found that the first Twelfth Night was held in the West Kingdom in 1967 and was specifically touted as being named for the Shakespearean play. The tradition spread as other Kingdoms emerged, and several local seasonal events throughout the Middle Kingdom adopted the name, including Nordskogen.

We did find a number of historical associations with the tradition of Twelfth Night. The Christmas closing feast, often irreverent, where it was tradition to remove holiday paraphernalia from the home the night prior to the Christian

celebration of Epiphany. We found the celebration of Twelve days and nights at this specific time of year also has roots in Celtic and Norse traditions, such as the twelve days and nights of Pagan yule, and some Roman traditions of Saturnalia, where each of the twelve months of the year was represented by a day of festival. A few political bodies outlawed the celebration of Twelfth Night as overly secular by the late Middle Ages. The active celebration of Twelfth Night appears to have continued regionally into the early 1800s, but by the 1900s, had been largely discontinued. With this history in mind, we asked our populace to join the conversation and share their thoughts.

Everyone expressed a strong commitment and desire to continue to improve inclusion, understanding that history and religion have intricate ties. The populace spoke eloquently, drawing from a variety of cultural and social experiences. Many of those who shared were concerned that excluding certain aspects of history, so long as they are not actively used as terms or symbols of modern religious practices, could devalue the opportunity to learn and fully appreciate the past we seek to re-create. It was also agreed that there are more active steps we can take to support the diverse members of the populace, and to keep an on-going and respectful conversation flowing to ensure an inclusive atmosphere. Based on the populace feedback, and with the inclusion of additional public acknowledgement that the title represents a specific approach to our study of the multi-faceted lens of history, we will keep the event title as Twelfth Night.

We feel that the title Twelfth Night, unlike Noel, is not currently exclusively tied to the modern observances of any specific religion and is instead largely associated with the anachronistic study of history, or Shakespeare's work. In addition, we will add the history and background of this title to the event website, as well as listing the other steps we will take to ensure our events are inclusive gatherings. This is an opportunity for everyone in our Kingdom to take a good look at past traditions, clarify how they include and celebrate everyone, and ensure they best serve the community we are today. For future assessments, we will recommend approaching with curiosity, seeking counsel, active listening, leading with kindness and maintaining paths of communication with the goal of inclusivity for the ultimate benefit of our community.
